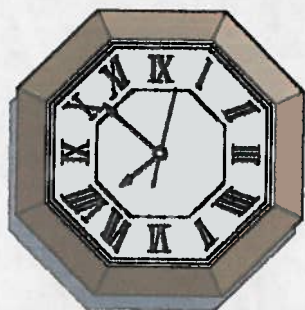
Dear Members,

TOURNAMENT REPORT

Lasswade Outdoor Open (972), Penicuik - 1st June 2003

33 archers from 8 clubs entered our annual Albion Windsor round this year, which due to problems at Lasswade meant that we re-located to Penicuik's outdoor range.

Unusually, all archers who entered turned up on the day with Lasswade represented by Bill M, Frank, David, Stuart and Jack.

Both the Lady and Gent Recurve trophies were retained by last years winners and 2 juniors from Ayr and Monklands are claiming their 6 Gold end badges.

As for our members David was just outside the medals in the Gents Recurve group to take 4th place with a score of 743. Frank finished 10th on 393 and due credit to him as this was his first outdoor tournament.

Another respectable score of 639 earned Stuart the 3rd place U16 boy.

Like Frank, Jack was shooting his first major tournament and took 2nd U12 boy with a 412. The best result of the day came from Bill M who took 2nd Compound Gent with a score of

888. Unlike last year the weather was dry, warm and bright with the occasional light breeze.

I would like to thank Derek, Richard and Norrie for helping to mark out the field and to Bill M, Joan and some Penicuik members who helped to get the range set up on the day.

A thank you as well to Billy who assisted me with the results.
