Child Protection

All parents were recently sent a letter as to how the Club would implement this policy and at the time of writing all bar one have sent back their responses indicating that they are all willing to supervise the juniors on a rota basis, as the Committee decided. As the parents were made aware junior archers become senior when they attain 18 years of age.

However, in Scotland they become adults at 16 so any over 16's do not need a parent or guardian thus the rota that has been issued to the parents will change when new under 16's arrive or others attain 16. For shooting purposes they will still enter tournaments in their appropriate age groups unless they wish to shoot in a higher age group or as a senior. I am aware that the rota system may be a bit of a chore for parents but at least GNAS are letting clubs adopt their own ideas and other clubs have already implemented systems similar to our own. We have also been recommended to have a Child Protection Officer and Joan has volunteered to take on this role. Joan and myself have already attended a seminar on Child Protection with possibly a further training session(s) which Joan would attend.

So if any parents have any questions then please see Joan or myself. If we do not have a ready answer then we will obtain advice from the C/P/O for archery in Scotland.

Some of you may have been given raffle tickets to sell by Joan in aid of the SAA Junior Team.



PROFILE ON A CLUB MEMBER

SUBJECT: DEREK SANGSTER -GENT RECURVE



With the Club's 25th Anniversary approaching in October what better way to start the year with a profile on our longest and only remaining founder member Derek Sangster.

The Club was formed in 1979 with Derek serving as the first president from 1979 to 1984 and since the beginning he has devoted a large amount of his time in the running and administration of our sport in Scotland.

As well as serving in one capacity or another on our club committee, he has also held various posts on the Eastern Area, SAA and currently he is the Scottish Director to GNAS.

As well as holding these posts he is also active as a tournament judge and in 1998 was promoted from County to Regional Judge with a further promotion to National Judge in 2001. Two years previous to this in 1999, I proposed him for Honorary Life Membership at the club's AGM and this was endorsed by the meeting. Currently Derek spends a considerable amount of time as an instructor for the GNAS leaders' course and he was my examiner when I took the course in 1997. As a club coach he has also taken part in many of our beginners' classes as well as advising our existing members when required. As you may have gathered because of the time he has devoted to the non-shooting side of our sport his personal shooting achievements are understandably modest: -

Outdoor Club Champion 1989 Lasswade Open Porstmouth 1991 Member of winning (Lasswade) Team Jim Coull (Club Trophy), 1979 and 2001.
